LOVE BUILDS BRAINS

This presentation explores the developing brain and the crucial role relationships with others play in healthy development. Relationships that are warm, responsive, and predictable help our children thrive, relationships that generate intense stress can harm the developing brain.

ATTACHMENT AND TEMPERAMENT IN CHILDCARE

The quality of the relationships that ECE educators make with the children in their care have a very big impact on the developing child. Attachment is the area of study that looks at who does a child turn to when distressed and it's crucial that children develop these attachment figures in childcare. In addition, the child's individual characteristics or temperament influence how they interact with the world, so understanding the different aspects of temperament and constellations is fully important to understanding the whole child. This in-depth session will explore these concepts with real life examples.



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
